What is Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the church season of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days (not counting the Sundays) of fasting, repentance and prayer prior to the celebration of Easter. On Ash Wednesday we attend Mass and during this the priest marks the sign of the cross on our foreheads using ashes. The ashes represent mourning and repentance. The ashes are gathered from the burning of the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This year Bishop Brian has taken some ashes from our bushfire ravaged South Coast which were added to our ashes from Palm Sunday. Using these ashes from the fires helps us keep all those affected close to our hearts this Lenten season.

During Lent we are asked to focus on three things – prayer, fasting and almsgiving. What are you going to do this Lent to prepare for the Easter Season? Have a discussion with your children about Lent and how you can as a family make a commitment to Lent.
